Chometz may be eaten on Monday, April 22nd until 10:36 A.M.

Rabbi Daniel will burn chometz at RPJC on Monday, April 22nd at 11:45 A.M.

The first Passover seder should be held on Monday, April 22nd at 7:30 P.M.

The second Passover seder should be held on Tuesday, April 23rd at 8:30 P.M.

Chometz that was sold may be eaten on Tuesday, April 30th after 9:36 P.M.

FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

<u>ADAR</u>

Adar is the 12th month on the Jewish calendar counting from Nisan.

The Hebrew name "Adar" is related to the word "adir," which denotes strength and power.

Tradition relates that Moses passed away and was born on 7 Adar.

The Talmud says. "When Adar enters, joy increases." This reaches its climax on the 14th of the month, as we celebrate the holiday of Purim, the day when Mordechai and Esther triumphed over the wicked Haman. Purim means "lots." Like a lottery, which is not rational or predictable, Purim expresses that which is above nature and human understanding.

The spirit of Purim permeates the entire month, making it a time of unparalleled rejoicing and good mazal (fortune) for the Jewish people.

We observe Purim by reading the Megillah (book of Esther), which recounts the story of the Purim miracle. This is done once on the eve of Purim and then again on the following day.

We give gifts of money to at least two poor people and gifts of two kinds of food to at least one person.

A traditional Purim food is hamantaschen, three-cornered pastries bursting with poppy seeds or another sweet filling. Although there is no obligation to eat hamantaschen on Purim, many enjoy fulfilling this custom. A festive Purim feast, which often includes wine or other intoxicating beverages, is included in the day.

Families and friends gather around the tables for the festive meal. It's actually a mitzvah to eat. Judaism is cool like that... The celebration resembles a traditional Jewish meal, but with a number of unique characteristics: Purim celebrates a miracle in which G-d's presence was hidden, so people often "hide" behind costumes. Both adults and kids can dress up. We are going to have a bit (or more than a bit) to drink, and otherwise act in ways you'd never see us act during the rest of the year.

When we meet each other on the joyous holiday of Purim, we greet each other with wishes of "happy Purim."

In Israel, we say "chag Purim sameach" - חג פורים שמח - and pronounce it KHAG poo-REEM sah-MAY-akh.

L'chaim!

NISAN

Nisan is in the Spring - Nisan is one of the few months mentioned in the Torah by name. G-d refers to it as Chodesh HaAviv, the Month of Spring. Ensuring that Nisan remains in spring forms the backbone of the entire intricate Jewish calendar, including the leap year.

It is the first month of the Jewish calendar - "This month shall be for you the first of the months," G-d told Moses. Curiously, it is one of four "heads of the year" listed in the Talmud.

G-d took us out of Egypt in Nisan - After 210 years of suffering in exile, G-d took His nation out of Egypt. This took place in the month of Nisan.

Passover Begins on the 15th - Passover, held annually on the anniversary of our Exodus, begins on the 15th of Nisan. Possibly the most widely celebrated Jewish holiday, Passover is observed by eating matzah and maror (bitter herbs) and drinking four cups of wine, during a special meal called the Seder, in which we recount the gripping story of the miraculous Exodus

It's Also a Name - Nisan is one of only two Jewish months whose names are also given names. Nisan is a fairly common name for boys, and Aviv and Aviva are fairly common male and female given names in Modern Hebrew. The only other month that is a name is Sivan, which is a common name for girls in Israel. Fun fact: Pesach (Passover) is the only Jewish holiday that is also given as a (male) name.

It is a miracle month - The word nes means "miracle," making Nisan a month of miracles.

Education and sharing day is in Nisan - To emphasize the vital role of education in society, the United States annually marks "Education and Sharing Day USA."

There is a blessing to be said over fruit trees - If one sees a budding fruit tree during the month of Nisan, there is a special blessing to be said: "Blessed are You ... Who has made nothing lacking in His world, and created in it goodly creatures and goodly trees to give mankind pleasure."

We don't say Tachanun all month - Because the first 12 days commemorate the joyous offerings of the princes, we don't say Tachanun (confession of sins) and similar prayers. Neither do we say it during the festival of Passover.


