FOCUS ON SISTERHOOD

- 1. If you have received an honor or aliyah, please be prompt in coming to services. You need to be in your seat at least 15 minutes before you're called for an assigned honor.
- 2. For strict security reasons, you are required to produce your seat ticket at the door. <u>Nobody will be admitted without a ticket</u>. Your cooperation is needed.
- 3. Air-conditioning may be on. Bring a covering for your comfort.

HIGH HOLY DAYS - 5781

We are making plans for the High Holiday and would like to outline some important guidelines that we all need to follow this year.

- All congregants must maintain physical distancing of 6 feet. Please keep this in mind when entering the Center building, entering the sanctuary, sitting in the sanctuary, exiting after services and using the bathrooms.
- All congregants and staff must wear face coverings.
- Your temperature will be checked by a staff member upon arrival. Anyone with a fever of 100.4 degrees or above will be denied entry.
- All seating is arranged by advance reservation. Seats will be clearly marked.
- Each person will be given a resealable plastic bag where you will place your machzor. You can leave the bag on your assigned seat, ready for the next synagogue service. This will ensure that no one else comes in contact with your book.
- We request that if possible, all men bring their own tallis to services. If a shul Tallis is used, then it will be placed in the plastic bag with your machzor. Ladies should bring their own head covering.
- The mezuzah should not be touched or kissed.
- The Rabbi and Cantor will maintain a distance of 6 feet. If a member is called for an aliyah, he will say the blessing from his seat. Saying blessings from a distance is approved by tradition. There will be no shaking of hands and the Torah will not be carried up and down the aisles.
- We will have hand sanitizer available. Bathrooms will be disinfected regularly.
- After services each day, we ask that everyone please exit promptly and not congregate together.
- We will be hiring a police officer from the NYPD for security during Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.
