FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

HIGH HOLIDAYS 2023

ROSH HASHANAH (September 15 - September 17, 2023)

Rosh Hashanah is the birthday of the universe, the day G-d created Adam and Eve, and it's celebrated as the head of the Jewish year. It begins at sundown on the eve of Tishrei 1 (Sept. 15, 2023) and ends after nightfall on Tishrei 2 (Sept. 17, 2023).

The central observance of Rosh Hashanah is blowing the *shofar* (ram's horn) on both mornings of the holiday (except on Shabbat), which is normally done in synagogues as part of the day's services.

Rosh Hashanah feasts traditionally include round challah bread (studded with raisins) and apples dipped in honey, as well as other foods that symbolize our wishes for a sweet year.

Other Rosh Hashanah observances include candle lighting in the evenings and desisting from creative work. Together with Yom Kippur (which follows 10 days later), it is part of the Yamim Nora'im (Days of Awe, or High Holidays).

YOM KIPPUR (September 24 - September 25, 2023)

What: Yom Kippur fast day is the holiest day of the year, when we are closest to G-d and to the essence of our souls. Yom Kippur means "Day of Atonement," as the verse states, "For on this day He will forgive you, to purify you, that you be cleansed from all your sins before G-d."

When: The 10th day of Tishrei (in 2023, from several minutes before sunset on Sunday, September 24, until after nightfall on Monday, September 25), coming on the heels of Rosh Hashanah (the Jewish New Year, which is on the first and second days of Tishrei).

SUKKOT (September 29 - Otober 6, 2023)

Sukkot is a weeklong Jewish holiday that comes five days after Yom Kippur. Sukkot celebrates the gathering of the harvest and commemorates the miraculous protection G-d provided for the children of Israel when they left Egypt. We celebrate Sukkot by dwelling in a foliage-covered booth (known as a *sukkah*) and by taking the "Four Kinds" (*arba minim*), four special species of vegetation.
